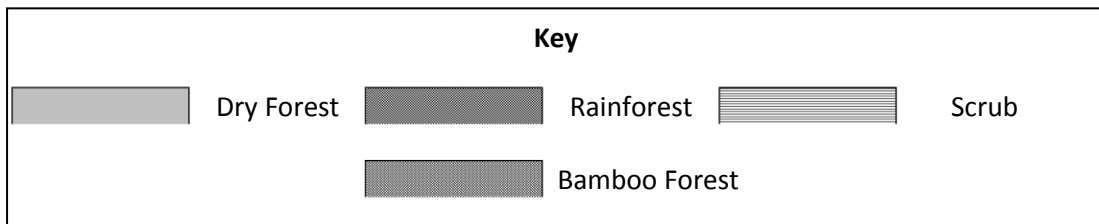

Using the enclosure signs around the park complete the following map of the world showing the distribution of our primates. Also use the key to show the type of habitat found in each of those areas.

The keepers at Wingham Wildlife Park have a lot of experience in hand rearing animals which have been rejected by their mothers. Our experience has allowed us to formulate our own milk for any given species by using 3 separate formulas. These are high fat, high protein and high carbohydrate formulas. When hand rearing Tigers, to every 10 parts of water we add 1 part high carbohydrate formula, 2 parts high fat formula and 4 parts high protein formula. If we are using 250ml of water to make a bottle of feed how many millilitres do we require of:
